### **Spring Testing April 10th.**

- On Tuesday April 10th United Township Freshmen will take the PSAT-9, Sophomores will take the PSAT-10 and Juniors will take the SAT Exam. These exams consists of four sectional tests (Reading, Writing and Language, Mathematics with and without a calculator. The Juniors will also complete an essay portion. Students will be released at 12:30 on this day.
- Free SAT prep, including test questions, diagnostic tools, and practice exams, is available on www.kahnacademy.org.
- SAT scores of 480 ELA and 510 Mathematics, are considered College and Career Ready by the College Board.
- The SAT is a graduation requirement for the class of 2018. All Illinois colleges will now except the SAT for college entry.

### **Dual Credit Courses**

- Students have finished registering for next year's courses. If they signed up for any dual credit courses, additional steps must be completed. They must fill out a BHC registration form, apply on-line and may need to take the Accuplacer exam. Students have been Accuplacer testing and more testing will be available after Spring Break.
- Payment for any dual credit classes will not be due until September, and that payment will be to BHC. Cost in 2018-2019 is \$25 per credit hour with the exception of Speech. Speech is taught by Black Hawk staff so full tuition is applied. The course will be taught at UTHS and the book is provided.



### **Registering for 2018-2019 Classes**

Students are finishing the registration process for the 2018-2019 school year. Materials have been distributed, new course offerings were discussed, appropriate patterns of course selections have been outlined, graduation requirements were highlighted and thoughtful selection of elective courses were encouraged. Students were given a week to review materials with their parents before having individual conferences with their counselors to turn in their actual course requests for next school year. ### No Child Left Behind and Highly Qualified Teachers

Federal legislation requires us to notify our community, parents and students of the qualifications of our teaching and para-professional staff. The legislation requires that we have only "highly qualified" staff in place by 2006. The legislation clearly sets forth the standards that define "highly qualified". In short, it means that teachers are certified in the specific areas they are teaching and that paraprofessionals have at least sixty (60) credit hours of college work. A list of our current staff is available for review in our administration center.
